

August 14, 2017

The board of Cessna Township Trustees opened in regular session on Monday, August 14, 2017 at 7:30 P.M. at the township hall with the fiscal officer and all trustees present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read along with the presentation of the monthly financial reports. Mr. Hull moved to accept all reports as presented. Mr. Ault seconded the motion with all voting aye.

The board heard from Jon Cross, candidate for State House of Representatives in the May 2018 primary.

Dick Pees was on hand to update the board on the activities of the Hardin County Sheriff's Office.

The aging lighting fixtures at the township hall was discussed. Two fixtures have failed within the last few weeks. Mr. Long made the motion to replace the current fluorescent fixtures with more energy efficient LED lights. The lights will be purchased by the township directly with the installation to be completed by Jacob's Electric from Kenton. Mr. Hull seconded the motion with all voting Aye.

Mr. Hull noted that the summer road patching had been completed.

The Purtee property still shows no sign of being brought back into compliance according to the zoning report of Mark Schwemer. Mr. Schwemer told the board that he has seen no response to the letters that he has sent to the property owners and that the county sanitarian has not proceeded any further with the septic complaint, stating that he believed the property to be vacant. The board asked Mr. Schwemer to prepare the needed paperwork to start the process of cleanup through the townships junk vehicle and vegetation ordinances.

It was noted that the New Holland Disc Mower was back to the dealership for repairs. The unit had completely locked up shortly after being delivered back to the township.

The Fiscal Officer noted that the winning bid of \$75 on the old UAN computer was from Jim Gossard.

Discussion was had regarding the damages to township roads caused by the pipeline installation crews. The trustee's will seek estimates on the cost of repair with the County Engineer's office and submit an estimate for the Marathon Pipeline Company to review.
