

April 10, 2017

The board of Cessna Township Trustees opened in regular session on Monday, April 10, 2017 at 7:30 P.M. at the township hall with the fiscal officer and all trustees present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read along with the presentation of the monthly financial reports. Mr. Hull moved to accept all reports as presented. Mr. Ault seconded the motion with all voting aye.

Kirk Shepherd asked the trustee’s about the amount of junk that is on the Keith Hughes property, inquiring if this was a violation of the township zoning ordinance. The trustee’s stated that they would ask the zoning officer to look into the complaint.

The property located on the triangle at CR 90 and SR309 was also discussed. An RV that has been reported to be hooked into the properties septic system was among the concerns about the property. The zoning officer was asked to contact the Hardin County Health department regarding the possible health code violation.

Dale Fall has been contacted regarding the annual township cleanup day scheduled for Saturday, April 1, 2017. Mr. Fall will be supplying the dumpsters for the event.

After reviewing the estimates from the Hardin County Engineer’s office for possible summer road projects, Mr. Ault moved to proceed with the list of projects by way of force accounts with the county engineer with the exception of the paving of the township parking lot. Mr. Hull seconded with all voting aye.

The board has also opted to not accept the parking lot bid from Quality Paving.

The need for culvert work at the corner of TR 90 and CR115 was discussed. Water from heavy rain has a history of covering the road as well as running onto the pump station owned by Marathon. The board agreed to consult with Marathon Oil Co. to see if they would be willing to participate in the culvert upgrade.

It was noted that the annual township cleanup day was completed, but the 4H club did not participate this year with roadside cleanup. The Hardin Northern High School students are going to be contacted to see if they would be willing to perform the roadside cleanup as a community service project.

Mr. Hull moved to participate in the OTA sponsored BWC group rating program for the following year. Mr. Long seconded with all voting aye.
