

March 08, 2021

The board of Cessna Township Trustees opened in regular session on Monday, March 08, 2021 at 7:00 P.M. at the township hall with the fiscal officer and all trustees present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read along with the presentation of the monthly financial reports. Mr. Eibling moved to accept all reports as presented. Mr. Vermillion seconded the motion with all voting aye.

Fred Rush, Hardin County Commissioner was present to update the trustee’s on current county issues. McGuffey Fire Chief Jerry Ault was present to discuss the pending MARCS radio grant application. It was noted that the early indications are that the full grant application was not going to be received and that the township’s application on behalf of the fire department was going to be accepted for a much smaller amount. Mr. Ault noted that he has sent the fire departments old MARCS radios out for possible repairs and that he will keep the township informed of the repair attempts.

An issue with standing water at the intersection of TR 90 and TR 125 was discussed. The water issue is occurring over the top of the Marathon pipelines and the Marathon engineering department will be contacted to seek a solution to the water issue.

The board reviewed the list of potential summer road projects and will finalize at the meeting with the Hardin County Engineer set to take place on April 14, 2021. Culvert issues at township road 84, 87, 90, and 115 were also discussed.

Mr. Vermillion moved and Mr. Hull seconded the motion to move forward with the annual Cessna Township Cleanup Day on Saturday, April 3, 2021. Joey Fall will be contacted about providing the dumpsters and transportation for the event. The Hardin Northern School students will be asked to provide roadside cleanup at a later date this Spring. The motion passed with all voting aye.

Mr. Vermillion motioned to proceed with the quote from Findlay Implement to purchase a new John Deere Rotary mower for the purpose of mowing roadsides as presented. Mr. Hull seconded with all voting aye. Mr. Eibling then motioned to advertise the old New Holland Rotary mower for sale to the highest bidder. Mr. Vermillion seconded the motion with all voting aye. The mower bid will be posted in The Kenton times as well as the township web page. Bid openings will be made at the April 12, 2021 regular meeting.

Mr. Schwemer was on hand to present his zoning report. He informed the board that a recent zoning variance for property owned by Randy Casper had been approved. The variance was granted with the stipulation that the lots be recorded as non-buildable due to lack of frontage requirements.
