

March 14, 2022

The board of Cessna Township Trustees opened in regular session on Monday, March 14, 2022 at 7:00 P.M. at the township hall with the fiscal officer and all trustees present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read along with the presentation of the monthly financial reports. Mr. Eibling moved to accept all reports as presented. Mr. Hull seconded the motion with all voting aye.

Mark Schwemer, Zoning Officer, gave his zoning report to the board. Mr.Schwemer noted that he had been in contact with the owner of the triangle property regarding the county program that would pay for razing of blighted properties as discussed last month. He stated that the owner of the property declined his offer to apply for the grant dollars to raze the home.

Mr. Vermillion moved to donate \$75 to the annual Hardin County Fireworks display as done in prior years. Mr. Eibling seconded with all voting aye.

The following road projects were discussed for the 2022 construction season:

- 1. Resurface Township Road 125 from State Route 309 to State Route 701 with #9 stone \$36,205.61
- 2. Resurface Township Road 100 from Township Road 125 to CR 135 with #8 stone \$13,131.11
- 3. Regrade and Repave the intersection of Township Road 80 at Township Road 87 \$ 2,795.00

Mr. Vermillion moved to proceed with the Hardin County Engineer’s bid for the above projects. Mr. Eibling seconded with all voting aye.

Mr. Hull moved to approve Bill Legge to replace the culverts at TR 80 and TR 87. Mr. Eibling seconded with all voting aye.

Discussion was had regarding cemetery lot sales in Salem Cemetery. The fiscal officer noted that the township has no records of burials in the front portion of the cemetery and asked the board if they were comfortable in selling lots without knowledge of prior burials. The fiscal officer stated that he has been in contact with a company that performs “ground penetrating radar” to detect if prior graves exist. After discussion, Mr. Hull moved to proceed with the Ground Penetrating Radar Service at a cost to not exceed \$2,200 as per the quote. Mr. Eibling seconded with all voting aye.

Mr. Eibling moved to send \$100,000 of MVL funds into the StarOhio MVL investment account per the recommendation of the fiscal officer. Mr. Hull seconded with all voting aye.

It was noted that the Cessna Township Annual Spring Cleanup day will be held on Saturday, April 2, 2022. Mr. Hull moved to contact Fall and Son’s for the needed dumpsters. Mr. Vermillion seconded with all voting aye. The fiscal officer will advertise the cleanup day in The Kenton Times.
